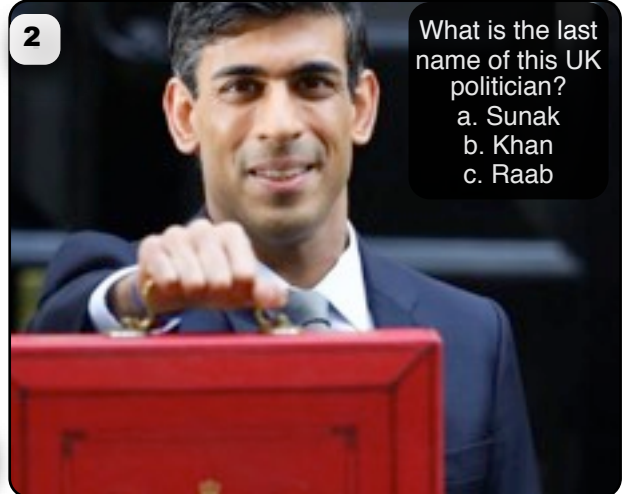

Weekly Quiz - Answers

1. The 80th anniversary of which major event was marked across the UK last week?
 - a. Battle of Britain - The battle, fought entirely in the air, was a dramatic turning point in World War Two. Fewer than 100 guests attended the 80th anniversary service in Westminster Abbey due to coronavirus restrictions. It usually attracts about 2,000 people. A flypast took place after the service, with a Hurricane and three Spitfires flying over central London.
2. Spain's largest city has seen large protests from residents in poorer areas due to renewed restrictions on movement and gatherings. What is the largest city in Spain?
 - c. Madrid - The renewed measures have been put in place in many in areas of lower income and with higher immigrant populations, and protestors are labelling it discrimination. Residents will only be able to leave their zone to go to work, school or to seek medical care. Social gatherings within their zone will be limited to six, public parks will be shut and commercial businesses will need to close by 22:00.
3. Why has the HSBC bank been in the news over the last week?
 - a. Their share price has fallen dramatically - Its role in a £62m fraud is detailed in the FinCEN leak of "suspicious activity reports". According to reports, HSBC allowed fraudsters to transfer millions of dollars around the world even after it had learned of their scam. It is the largest bank in Europe, and the 6th largest in the world.
4. What was the name of the hurricane that recently caused widespread damage along the east coast of the United States?
 - c. Hurricane Sally - Storm Sally battered the US Gulf Coast, Florida and Alabama with rain and storm surges, downed power lines, turned roads into rivers and left homes submerged.
5. Which of the following food brands plans to change its name due its current cultural inappropriateness?
 - b. Uncle Ben's (rice) - Uncle Ben's Rice will change its name to Ben's Original and remove the image of a smiling, grey-haired black man from its packaging. The change follows through on a pledge its owner Mars Food made in June to review the brand amid global protests over police brutality and racism. Uncle Ben's entered the market in the 1940s and was for decades the best-selling rice in the US.

Lineker was the highest-earning star with an unchanged salary of £1.75m in the 2019/20 financial year. But close behind is Radio 2 presenter, Zoe Ball, who has seen her pay rise by £1m since taking over the breakfast show in 2019.

Japan - Osaka is the second largest metropolitan area in Japan and among the largest in the world with more than 20 million inhabitants.

British athlete James Teagle was on course to win third place in the competition when he made a mistake metres from the finish. Méndrida overtook him but noticed the error and stopped to allow Teagle to cross first. Méndrida was also awarded honorary third place by the organisers and given the same €300 prize money.

1. **c. Pangolin** - The pangolin, a scaly mammal often described as looking apologetic, has been suggested as an intermediary animal in the journey of SARS-CoV-2 from bats into humans.
